School performance profile: Moved from a "targeted" status to an "acceptable"

Still targeted for: English learners, Individualized Education Plan (students with disabilities that need additional support).

28% improvement in chronic absenteeism.3.5% increase in math proficiency17% increase in science proficiency

Collecting more culture data from families through Panorama Survey that tracks feelings on:

- Student/teacher relationships
- Sense of Safety
- Sense of belonging

Started a student leadership class. Working to obtain honest student feedback and ideas for change.
